Land Acknowledgement

The stories we tell today rise from the ground sown by the story-tellers who have come before. Chicago is the traditional homeland of the Council of Three Fires: the Ojibwe, Odawa and Potawotami nations, as well as the Miami, Ho-Chunk, Fox, and the Illinois Confederacy of the Peoria and Kaskaskia nations. In 1830 Congress forcibly stripped these tribes of their land by passing the Indian Removal Act which led to relocation, poverty, and starvation. We wish to recognize the many indigenous people who continue to call Chicago home, who serve as stewards for their cultures and guardians for their land and waterways. We also wish to acknowledge the violent history of the space we use today. We are learning how to take more accountability for and responsibility for the land we also call home.

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR



'ART' is a play about love; the love of art and the art of love. Through a trio of friends, Yasmina Reza mines all the peculiarities and splendor of platonic connections. Her characters are at once infuriating and relatable. Even as we judge the absurdity of their dynamics, we can relate to their passions, loyalties, and insecurities. Love, after all, inspires deep devotion and utter ridiculousness. When we

love something, or someone, we can become the best versions of ourselves, or we can completely lose our heads. Sometimes one and then the other in short order.

Love can be gentle, or love can be volatile. Especially the love between friends. Friendships are often our longest relationships. We depend on our friends through thick and thin, in the best and worst moments of our lives. We rely on them during a career change, a divorce, or a major loss. Friends provide continuity through the passage of time. When we feel we don't know our friends, it's as though we don't know ourselves. Naturally, we would do anything we can to restore order in our platonic relationships and our perception of who we are. Though, true friendship can only sustain if it can evolve with the evolution of self. What is one to do? This is the crux of '*ART*' and this is the genius of Yasmina Reza.
